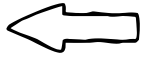


Guillaume & Marie-Camille

3. His favorite school subjects(to be/to have) science and Mathematics.

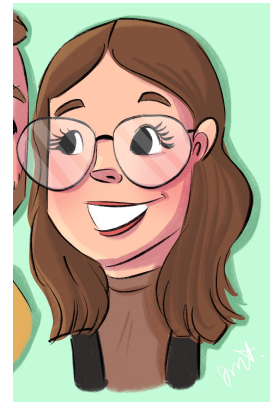
4. After school, he (to be/to have) a skateboarder. He practiced every day at the skate park.

6. But, she (to be/to have) a determined student.

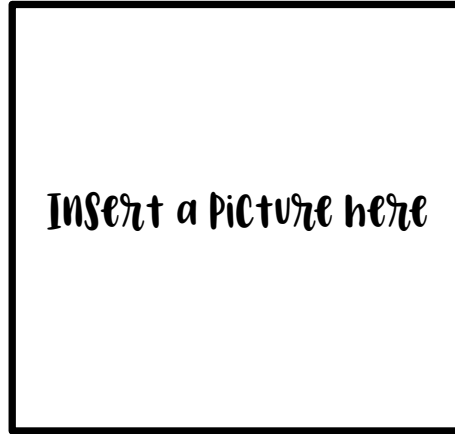
7. She worked very hard and she (to be/to have) a dream to become a teacher.
