
"The Famous Dinner Table"

Thank you for choosing one of my products! My students absolutely love this activity every year, and I know your students will, too! I usually do this activity right after I have taught my students how to properly punctuate dialogue.

Each student in your class will be having a dinner party and may invite four guests for this writing activity. The guests must be famous, and they may be from the past or the present. They may be from any field (entertainment, sports, politics, medicine, science, etc.) This is where the fun begins! I always tell my students to invite a combination of guests who will have some fun discussion at the dinner table. Imagine the conversation between George Washington and Justin Bieber! It makes my students laugh just thinking about it! The combinations that they come up with each year never cease to amaze me. Just reading these narratives makes ME laugh out loud, too!

We use the brainstorming sheets first to plan our parties, and my students can't wait to get started writing. I have included pages for the rough draft and good copy for your convenience.


